No Relatives Here

£31,525 will of Miss Kate Eugenie Meredith, seventy-seven, of Courtland-terrace, Merthyr Tydfil, bequeaths the residue of her property to her cousins, Reginald John Pain and Gomer Richard Pain.

The two brothers, who are chief beneficiaries, have lived in New Zealand since pre-war days. Little is known of them, as Miss Meredith had no relatives in this country.

£24,767 was the fortune left by Sir Charles Henry Collett, of Glebe Knoll, Beckenham-lane, Bromley, Kent, Lord Mayor of London 1933-34, who died last November, aged 74.

He left £500 and 94 7/8 per cent. preference shares in Colletts, Ltd., each to his sons Richard Innn Collett, David Collett and Roger Collett, and £500 each to his sons John and Thomas Collett.

He said that he made no further provision for his children except Henry Seymour Collett, not through lack of affection, but because he considered it his duty to leave the residue to his son, Henry Seymour Collett, to enable him properly to maintain the Baronetcy to which he would succeed.
